- A. Return to School Roadmap The Governor's Executive Order 2020-142 as well as the MI Safe School: Michigan's 2020-21 Return to School Roadmap was explained. Osceola County is in Phase 4 which allows students to return to face to face instruction following the required protocols. A plan for Preparedness must be prepared for each of the three phases outlined in the Roadmap. If we find ourselves in Phase 1, 2 or 3, schools will be closed and all instruction will be done virtually. In Phase 5 the required protocols in Phase 4 are lifted. The entire plan must be approved by our Board of Education by August 12<sup>th</sup> to allow students to start on August 19, 2020.
- B. Handbook Update Due to the new plans, handbooks will need more revisions before finalizing.
- C. Board Policy Gerald Nichols will meet with Shirley on Thursday, July 16 and Alan Bengry will meet with her on Friday, July 17 to review and revise board policies sent from Thrun.
