CURRENT MASKING REQUIREMENTS

On Thursday the CDC announced that effective February 25, 2022, it no longer required the wearing of masks on buses and vans operated by public or private school systems, including early care and educational/child care programs. As of yesterday, we no longer required our students to wear masks when using school transportation. However, for those who are comfortable with wearing a mask, we do encourage you to continue to do so.

The guideline for a student who is a close contact with a student who has tested positive has not changed since my last update. Students who are close contacts and who are symptom free will remain in school. Parents will be notified that their child was a close contact and asked to monitor their student for symptoms for 10 days. As long as the student does not exhibit any symptoms he/she can continue to come to school. The student will not be required to wear a mask although masks are encouraged.
